Moving Walkway


- 1. Running with the walkway Active white supremacist
- 2. Walking with the walkway Entitled to say or do any racist thing anywhere, any time they feel like it.
- 3. Occasionally stepping with the walkway "I'm not racist but, ..."
- 4. Standing still a) See themselves as "good people", b) Say, "I can't be racist, I've adopted two children of color", c) Don't know that they don't know.
- 5. Turned around and standing still A little information, a little action, and yet face all of the oncoming racism with inaction; "I tried to fight racism at my kid's school once and it just didn't work."
- 6. Occasionally stepping against the walkway Occasionally interrupting a joke, challenging a comment, or educating someone else.
- Walking against the walkway Challenging racism on a daily / regular basis.
- 8. Running against the walkway Challenging white privilege / white supremacy on a daily / regular basis.
