# **Environmental Justice Community Solar Gardens:**

- To educate and promote Community Solar Garden subscriptions for church and congregants
- In collaboration with MUUSJA Community Solar Garden Project to develop a joint UU Community Solar Garden for Twin City area UU churches

## **Scope of Participation:**

- Contracting with a developer to create an off-site (not on church roof) solar garden for Twin City area UU churches
- No up-front investment required to subscribe, just monthly payments for service. Subscriber can terminate service at any time
- Planned Phase 1: Subscribe First Universalist administration for <u>church</u> solar electricity savings through monthly bill credits
- Planned Phase 2: Subscribe First Universalist congregants and friends for congregant residential solar electricity savings through monthly bill credits
- Program to include joining together with other Twin City UU Churches and congregations in a MUUSJA project to enable most favorable contract prices and terms
- UU Churches and congregants can subscribe separately and are not bound to participate in one Community Solar Garden

#### **Key Focus:**

- Lower electricity costs both church and resident with solar garden billing credits
- Reduce carbon footprint by millions of tons of CO2
- Live out our seventh UU Principle of "Respect for the interdependent web" by caring for our Earth home
- **Support First Universalist Environmental Justice** by making program participation available to low-income residents
- Collaborate with other faith-based groups: MUUSJA and Minnesota Interfaith
  Power & Light to coordinate participation, to leverage resources, to conduct
  education, and to maximize outreach
