• Mobilizing religious support for landmark legislation to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Minnesota, educating hundreds of thousands of congregants, and working with every major religious denomination in the state.

Scope of Participation:

- **Mission:** We believe the active care of creation is integral to spiritual life and social justice. We respond to climate change by bringing Minnesota's faith communities together and by providing opportunities for congregations to join the growing climate justice movement.
- *Membership:* Over 200 MN Faith Communities focused on reducing carbon pollution

Key Focus:

- Be the Spark: Convening leaders in faith communities for training and inspiration to
 design custom programs for a faith community or denomination, to participate in fourpart workshop series that builds community and skills for leading in a faith community.
- **Youth Be The Spark:** Empowering youth by gathering for outdoor fun and leadership training, and then returning to their home congregations to spark the movement. Providing on-going mentorship and support to participating congregations.
- Climate Conversations: Breaking the silence on climate change through a relational approach to organizing. Facilitating large group or small group conversations, and train leaders to launch a climate conversation campaign in your community. Examples included: Letter writing to support EPA's "Clean Power Plant Plan", marches and demonstrations such as the "Peoples Climate March", and Lobbying for MN legislation that creates a legal framework for cutting carbon 30%, and increasing the share of electricity from renewable sources to 40% by 2030
- Cool Congregations: Empowering faith communities to become carbon neutral.
 Working with MN Green Corp member, and MNIPL staff to create a carbon reduction
 plan for your congregation. Working with you to conduct an energy audit, and create a
 certified carbon reduction plan for your house of worship. Helping your congregation
 connect the dots between what you do in your home congregation and the global
 movement so that your actions are part of the emerging social justice story. Examples
 include: Investing in soon-to-be-available solar gardens

How to be Involved: Participate in monthly volunteer led, volunteer run teams:
