#### **About Our Guest Preacher**

Rev. K.P. Hong currently serves as the Director of Religious Education at Unity Church-Unitarian in St. Paul, where he's learning that children are masters at opening things: everything from toothpaste to bottles to cabinet drawers to words to the meaning of life to the Sacred. Children are masters at questioning, and any attempt to offer closure to such openings is a wonderful mistake. Prior to being schooled by children, K.P. worked as a chaplain at Macalester College and served as clergy in the New York Conference of The United Methodist Church. He comes to ministry shaped by Korean Buddhism and Christianity and the increasing experience of religious hybridity in the world today.

#### Offering: Families Moving Forward
