Musical Notes by Jerrod Wendland

Ann Southam (1937-2010) was a Canadian composer and philanthropist, known for her electronic music, collaborations with dancers, and immense cycles of piano music, much of it in a minimalist style. The 15 pieces called *Glass Houses* all use a repeated pattern in the left hand with an endlessly varying melody in the right; the title might be an oblique reference to Philip Glass, or it might just be a warning to potential stone-throwers. I found two quotes of particular interest: "Being gay and growing up gay in the fifties was not amusing. Life was pretty much a social nightmare. The perfect solution was to be an artist. I could be as moody and anti-social as I liked." And: "I really like what happens to the player, what happens to the listener when there's nothing happening. What are you going to do with that time? ... I'm exploring how you might set up periods of waiting in which nothing happens. Things are definitely happening. It's just having to keep still and having to wait. That's very hard to do. Patience — this is a whole lesson in patience."

February Worship Theme: Brokenness

"Life will break you. Nobody can protect you from that, and living alone won't either, for solitude will also break you with its yearning. You have to love. You have to feel. It is the reason you are here on earth," - Louise Erdrich. Brokenness is part and parcel of being human. We are born into families that fall short, or social constructs that privilege one group over another. Brokenness is. When we don't admit brokenness, the truth of our stories, then we don't make room for understanding, the healing balm of confession, and the deep well of compassion. All is available to us, but first we must admit brokenness.
